The Welsh Assembly Government's Plans for children and young people in Wales with Autism and Asperger's Syndrome.

The Welsh Assembly Government is trying to make sure that everything it does for children and young people is based on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is an agreement signed by about 200 countries. It wants all children and young people to have a happy and healthy life.

The Welsh Assembly Government wants to make special plans for children and young people with Autism and Asperger's Syndrome. In the plan, they use the words Autistic Spectrum Disorders to describe people with Autism and Asperger's syndrome.





Here is a list of things that the Welsh Assembly Government wants to do for children and young people with autism and Asperger's Syndrome:

- They want people such as teachers, dentists, doctors, nurses, policemen and shop assistants to understand more about Autism and Asperger's Syndrome. They want people to be able to help you when you need them.
- They want to give someone the job of making sure that across Wales you have the services you need. Services can include schools, colleges, somewhere to work, somewhere to live, places to do the things you like best and have some fun.
- They want all the people in your local area that know a lot about autism and Asperger's Syndrome such as teachers, social workers, therapists, psychologists, doctors and nurses to work together as a team to make sure that you and your family are happy.
- They would like each local area to have someone who can act as your champion and make sure that you live and learn in an environment that does not make you feel anxious and afraid.
- They are going to produce documents that will tell people who work with you at school how they can make school better for you.
- They want to make sure that when you leave school you have the help you need at college or in a job of work. They know that sometimes change can be very frightening for you so they want to make sure you know exactly what is going to happen when you have to leave school.
- They want to find out just how many people there are in Wales who have autism and Asperger's Syndrome.

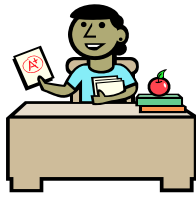

The Welsh Assembly Government want to have someone working in Wales who can help to make sure that everyone in Wales who has autism or Asperger's Syndrome has the services they need.

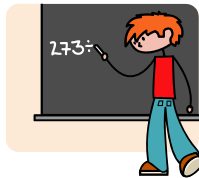

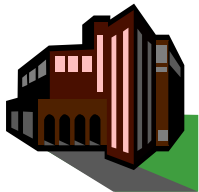

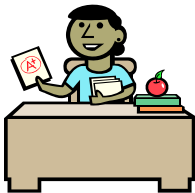
